What is KEYTRUDA[®] used for?

KEYTRUDA®, also known as pembrolizumab, is a prescription medicine used to treat:

- A kind of skin cancer called melanoma in adults
 - KEYTRUDA® may be used alone as your first treatment when your skin cancer:
 - has spread or cannot be removed by surgery (advanced melanoma)
- A kind of lung cancer called non-small cell lung cancer in adults
 - KEYTRUDA® may be used alone as your first treatment when your lung cancer:
 - has spread (advanced lung cancer), or
 - has not spread outside your chest (Stage III) and you cannot have surgery or chemotherapy with radiation, and
 - tests positive for "PD-L1", and
 - if your tumour does not have an abnormal "EGFR" or "ALK" gene

It is not known if KEYTRUDA® is safe and effective in children less than 18 years of age.

People get KEYTRUDA® when their cancer has spread or cannot be taken out by surgery.

Serious side effects and what to do about them

Be aware of possible side effects

Keep this leaflet on you. The symptoms map on the back lists the major side effects you should look out for. These side effects can sometimes become life-threatening and can lead to death. These side effects may happen anytime during treatment or even after your treatment has ended. If you have any of them, call or see your doctor **right away**. Your doctor may give you other medicines to prevent more severe complications and reduce symptoms. Your doctor may withhold the next dose of KEYTRUDA® or stop treatment with KEYTRUDA®. Do not self-treat any of these symptoms without the approval of your healthcare team.

ALK=anaplastic lymphoma kinase; EGFR=epidermal growth factor receptor; PD-L1=programmed cell death ligand 1

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








What to look out for



- Hair is falling out
- Tender lumps on my skin

RELATED TO THE INFUSION
